Bayshore Gardens Park & Recreation District Elections

Our charter states: "(5) In accordance with chapter 189, Florida Statutes, this act, and section 418.21(1)(a), Florida Statutes, the district is governed by a nine-member board of trustees, elected on a popular vote basis by the residents of the district. The trustees shall hold office for a term of 4 years and may succeed themselves. Election of succeeding boards of trustees shall be held biennially on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of December of each odd- numbered year. Said election shall be held at the Bayshore Gardens Recreation Hall in the district between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m...."

In 2023 the term of office of trustees sitting in odd-numbered seats was ended. Each of those trustees went to the District Office to obtain a package from the Supervisor of Elections' office. The information in this packet required candidates to gather a minimum of 25 signatures of residents of Bayshore Gardens. Packets were then presented to the office to determine candidates were qualified to run for re-election.

This year the incumbents included Barbara Greenberg, Terry Zimmerly, Dan Rawlinson, Belle Baxter and Kyle Weatherly. As only those five people were qualified to run, no election was necessary. Those Trustees will be re-sworn at the January organizational meeting to be held on January 3, 2024.

Had there been another resident qualified to run for a Trustee position, an election, run by the Supervisors' office would be held in December 5th. Cost of this election would be \$4000.00.

LONG-TERMPlanning Committee

The committee met in September to continue to map out the planning process as well as looking at restoration of the beach, which had the most resident interest from a prior survey. A committee member met with Florida Department of Environmental Protection to discuss the possibility/probability and the process. Removal of some mangroves is necessary. It is doable as far as the department is concerned, with the required permit. Further research needs to be done to determine the cost, community interest, and time table.

The planning process itself is continuing. A draft community assessment survey was discussed in October along with the details of getting a good return rate. Community input will guide the plan for additional facilities/activities. The survey will be mailed to every address in our community, with a return, self-addressed stamped envelope for ease of response. For instance, a question will be on the survey asking if you want the beach restored. Your response will determine whether or not we pursue the project. In late October, the Board of Trustees approved the funds to complete the survey. It should be ready to distribute in January. Your input is very important. More details next month.

The committee is always looking for additional members or guests. Watch the Bayshore Banner (Bayshoregardens.org) calendar for date and time of our December meeting.

WE THE PEOPLE

One piece of exciting news this month is that the Board of Trustees has approved the funds for a community assessment in the form of a written survey. This will guide the district in spending money over the long term. I cannot stress enough the need for our residents to fill out the short survey and put it back in your mailbox in the enclosed, stamped envelope. The survey and other enclosed information is your invitation to be part of your community and to tell the Board of Trustees how you want them to represent you and spend your tax dollars in a way which would benefit vou. There are lots of possibilities. Some things can be purchased in a relatively short period of time like a new pool slide. Other things that cost more money will need to be saved for over one or more years, depending on the cost. It is no different than you saving for a desired thing.

Another piece of news is that the basketball court is finished and we have two brand new pickleball courts. Just drive up to the recreation center and see them for yourself. They are beautiful as well as functional. Rules of use are being finalized.

Thirdly, a resident has requested cold water lap swimming during the winter months. Two absolutes were discussed at the November board workshop. There must be at least two swimmers at all times, and the swimmers must be wearing wet suits. Times available, access, etc. will be worked on in committee.

"We the People" is a resident group, like the HOA here, but we discuss happenings and let our board know how we feel about a particular thing being discussed in the district. Our HOA is a social group which has great low cost monthly breakfasts as well as children's' parties around some holidays, organized yard sales, etc.


