The poem can be found in the April section of a collection of his writings titled, "A Hundred Good Points of Husbandry." The poem goes as follows: Sweet April showers Do spring May flowers

While this poem is clearly a direct ancestor to the version we know today, let's travel back in time a bit further to the end of the Fourteenth Century, where legendary poem Geoffrey Chaucer had his own say on the month of April in his famous collection of stories titled, "The Canterbury Tales." Chaucer's version goes as follows:

Original:

"Whan that Aprill, with his shoures soote
The droghte of March hath perced to the roote
And bathed every veyne in swich licour,
Of which vertu engendred is the flour;"

Translation:

"When in April the sweet showers fall That pierce March's drought to the root and all And bathed every vein in liquor that has power To generate therein and sire the flower;"

While Chaucer speaks of April in relation to March rather than April, it could certainly be said that while Thomas Tusser may be the father of this saying, Geoffrey Chaucer is certainly the grandfather.

The meeting was called to order at 1:15 by Marlene Durgin, President. Twelve were present.

Marlene asked for motion to accept the February Minutes. Marie Young made a motion to accept the minutes. Jeanne Corbin seconded the motion. Marie gave the Treasurer's Report. We have 21 Members. Gwen Norris provided refreshments that were enjoyed by all during and after the meeting.

Kathy Rowe is arranging our trip to the 'Paradise Found Nursery (3570 Tallevast Rd, Sarasota). Today's attendees agreed that a carpool from the Hall at 1:00. Marlene Durgin, Gwen Norris, Winnie Denny-Smith, and Melanie Woodruff volunteered to drive. Winnie will bring refreshments. Kathy will call the Nursery and remind them we are coming.

Saturday, March 16th there will be an event at Elwood Park Baptist Church (3516 45 St E, Bradenton) 9am-3pm. Plant vendors, farm/homestead vendors, arts & crafts vendors, and Mixon Swirl Food Truck.

Saturday, March 23rd, 9am-1pm is the Master Gardener's Spring Plant sale (1303 17th St W Palmetto, FL). Gwen will send a text prior these events for those who want to carpool. See the March Master Gardener's Garden bench publication:

Joyce is working on a new Roster. She asked if we are starting our summer break in June this year. We compared the earliest version of the calendar and the current one.

Presentations:

Marlene Durgin presented on the Polydamas swallowtail butterfly. It is our only United States swallowtail without tails. Marlene had a large quantity of these butterflies last year. The females are larger than the males. It takes four to six days for eggs to hatch, if it is 80 degrees, longer if cooler.

The newborn larva eats its own eggshell. The caterpillar stage, is about 24 days, depending on weather, less if warmer. They molt every four days, then eat their exuviae. Their host plant is the Dutchman pipe vine. The caterpillars are ferocious eaters and when young group together as they eat the vine leaves. The pupas are cocooned in a sack that looks like a brown bag or folded leaf, attached by spun silk girdles to a branch.

We thanked Marlene for a great presentation.

Melanie Woodruff began her demonstration on teacup flower arrangements by suggesting the cup be glued/epoxied to the saucer to keep it secure. The flowers are artificial, made by Sola Wood, sheet of wood from the tapioca plant. The wood blooms can be stiff. Glycerin will make the petals more pliable. A ratio of 1:10 to 1:8 Glycerin to water will work. Glycerin must be kept in the refrigerator or will mold. Melanie had dyed the blooms in different acrylic dyes. Very pretty.

Melanie demonstrated how a florist wire can cut the floral foam blocks to size and how it can be molded to fit the inside of the cup. She demonstrated how a florist wire (18ga) can be pushed up into the bloom for a stem and then inserted into the foam. Voila.

We adjourned from the presentations and worked on our teacup at 1:50. There were plenty of blooms in many colors, wire, and imitation moss, baby's breath, and greenery supplied for the ladies to decorate their teacups (or a teacup supplied.)

We thanked Melanie for a great demonstration and project.
