The Bayshore Gardens Park and Recreation District is a Special Taxing District created by the Legislature of Florida. Our Rec. Center property is governed by a nine-person Board of Trustees to maintain the District.

We are one of the few subdivisions who actually have the right to vote on the Budget which is presented to us each Spring. (FEW resident homeowners actually vote)
The annual assessment is collected by Manatee County Tax Collector on the real estate tax bill.

The pool has been cleaned up from the storms and we are just waiting for Manatee County to approve the replacement of the old electrical panel that was destroyed. I would like to thank all of the volunteers that came out to help and many of the local businesses that donated to the Bayshore Gardens Canal Clean Up that was held on Saturday, February 22, 2025. It was a huge success.

The new and improved playground installation started on February 17th and is expected to take approximately two (2) weeks to be completed. I apologize that the park has to be temporarily closed for safety reasons while the installation is taking place, but it will reopen as soon as the playground installation is completed. We are still waiting for Manatee County to approve the permit for roof replacement on the main building so that installation can begin.

Bayshore Gardens is a community of approximately 1406 single family homes located in southern portion of Manatee County along Sarasota Bay. In 1979, the Florida Legislature established Bayshore Gardens as an independent special taxing district. Special taxing Districts are special purpose governmental units that exist separately from local governments and are formed to perform a single function. Each resident of the District pays an annual assessment within their real estate taxes which funds the operational needs of the District. This annual fee is currently \$417. We are not an HOA, although we have a voluntary Club called the HOA which a resident may join for an annual fee of \$10.

Did You Know?

St Patrick wasn't Irish

St. Patrick was actually British, born to Roman parents in either Scotland or Wales (no one is exactly sure which). After being forced into slavery by Irish pirates, he turned to his Christian faith and became one of the first people to bring the religion to the country around the year 432.

We should actually be wearing blue.

Historians say that St. Patrick's color was blue, not green. The use of green on the holiday became common during the 1600s and 1700s, when the clover became a symbol of nationalism and wearing green on lapels became the norm.

There are more Irish people in America than in Ireland.

According to recent census data, there are 39.6 million Americans who list their heritage as primarily or partially Irish, compared to 6.3 million people in Ireland.

It used to be a dry holiday.

Up until the 1970s, St. Patrick's Day was considered a religious holiday in Ireland, meaning all the pubs in the country were closed, thanks to a law written by Parliament member James O'Mara. However, Ireland later realized that they could attract lots of tourists for the holiday, and the (green) beer was suddenly free-flowing.

Secretary report deferred due to absence of Susan. There have been no meetings since the November meeting, but those minutes were not available for review.

Treasurer's report by Joyce. All funds match the bank balance after deposits and expenses.
Membership for 2025: 50.

New Business:

Marlene suggested that we increase HOA membership to \$10 per individual and \$15 per family due to an increase in costs. Possibly later this year or for next year.

The HOA sponsored a 50's Dance in partnership with homeowner Donna Myers. The event was successful with music, food and dancing to live music. There were about 70 in attendance. A great time was had by all. The next HOA sponsored dance will be a disco themed party on March 7, 2025. And another party on April 4, 2025 is also in the early planning stages.

In further discussion on aforementioned dance, Marlene suggested that HOA have a cover charge at the dance and that HOA would donate the money. An announcement and sign should say '\$1 cover charge to be donated to the Bayshore Elementary School.' HOA has successfully donated to the Bayshore Elementary School in the past with much appreciation.

Marlene suggested that we move the HOA meetings to the 'first Thursday' of each month. All agreed. This will need to be posted in the Banner and on the bulletin boards.

Marlene suggested that we rename the club to 'The Neighborhood Club-formally HOA' as the use of 'HOA' has a stigma to it.

Gwen said the 'Bayshore Gardens Homeowner Association' is registered with the State (Sunbiz.com) as a nonprofit Association. We agreed to keep the registered name alone and refer to the club as 'The Neighborhood Club' in the Banner and other announcements.

Old Business:

The HOA discussed that cooking in the kitchen at the Recreation Hall is not allowed in our kitchen oven. Dan made a motion that a grill be purchased for cooking outside and stored in the HOA room with the HOA freezer. He said we should pay no more than \$200 for the grill. Gwen said it must be small enough for us to handle and store. Marie has a grill that she could loan until we get a grill for the club.

Also of note, the HOA freezer was damaged in Hurricane Helena floods and had to be discarded. Dan had found/bought a replacement upright freezer for about \$428.

General Discussion:

Jane King asked if the list of suggested club functions in the Banner has had any responses. Joyce said she has had a few.

Gwen asked about a 'pool opening party'. Dan said the pool had been drained and filled and the pumps installed. They were trying to get it ready for spring break.

Jane said she would like to look into a cruise out of Marina Jacks. She volunteered to get prices, required number of people and availability for April.

GARDEN CLUB MINUTES

Minutes for February 3rd, 2025

We held our February 3rd meeting in the Hall. Sixteen members and two guests attended.

Marlene Durgin, President, opened the meeting at 1:00.

The minutes from the January 6th meeting were available for review.

Marlene Durgin moved to accept the Minutes. Marie Young seconded the motion. It was noted that the February Banner had listed \$0.00 dues for Garden Club dues on page 5. Gwen will email the Banner to have it corrected to \$5.00 for the Garden Club dues in the March Banner issue.

Marlene thanked Matilda and Venessa Renovalez for the providing refreshments. We were encouraged to get our treats while the presentation was being set up.

Marlene Durgin introduced Master Gardener, John Dawson, and Sarah Clark (nearing Master Gardener), from the Manatee County Master Gardener Volunteer Program.

Seed Saving presentation: John Dawson began with the history and importance of seeds.

- The seed has all the 'information' needed to make a plant. Plants are important.
- There are diverse ways that the seeds travel from its parent plant, flying/floating, dropping, hitching a ride, and others.
- The American Indians would plant corn, and beans to climb the corn, and gourds to grow in the shade of the corn. They could place a seed in a clay lump. The lump would erode once the rains came and allow the seed to sprout. The Indians would return to a garden.
- Johnny 'Appleseed' Chapman (1774-1845) planted apple seedlings and seeds throughout the north territory (as far west as Illinois). He also taught settlers how to grow from seed.

- Discussion on Hybrid vs Heirloom. Gardeners cherish and share their Heirloom seeds. The Heirloom seed will grow into the parent plant every time. The seed from a hybrid plant may not grow at all.
- References: Seedsavers.org has all you need in seeds, where to buy them, and information beyond. Organic Seed Alliance are advocates and educators. 'Seed to seed' by Susanne Ashworth is a good reference.

We all thanked John Dawson for an informative presentation and for Sarah Clark for helping.

Marie Young gave the Treasurer's report. Kathy Rowe gave the thought of the day: "Folks are as happy as they make up their mind to be" – Abe Lincoln.

Gwen Moved to adjourn. Yvette LeBaron seconded the motion. We adjourned at 2:20 PM.

SATURDAY WORKSHOPS

This article was written February 12th. At this time, we had three Workshops with steady progress. We thank the hardworking participants: Harold Donaldson, John Woodruff, Richard Jackerson, Richard Etheridge, Vincent Tricario, Jim Couey, and Gwen Norris. Gwen supplied refreshments.

First - the shop tools were rearranged, shop cleaned, and damaged (moldy) wood removed, and an area cleared for work on tools. The damaged hand tools were removed (battery drill and orbital hand sander). Progress (after three Workshops): The band saw works, one dust collector works, the sink is changed-out and new faucet installed. The air compressor was dismantled - needing a compressor and regulator. The wall outlets were labeled to coincide with the electrical panel numbers.

Tools that still needing repair, or replacement – Planer, Air Compressor, one Dust Collector, and Jointer.

Note: The air stapler (gun) is still missing. Borrowers need to RETURN borrowed tools.

Equipment problems? If there is any problem with a tool, please notify an officer and leave a note/tag on the tool. Tags are on top of the metal cabinet along the north wall. All flood damaged tools are tagged stating the same.

2025 Club Officers' phone numbers are listed on the front window. Use safety equipment when using any power tool. Shop users are required to sign-in at the door and clean up after using the Shop.

Our next scheduled meeting is Saturday, March 8, 2025, at 10:00 am in the Shop. We hope to see you at the meeting.

Workshop notices will be emailed to members (and non-members). Everyone is welcome to bring good energy, motor knowledge and organizational skills to get the Shop up to 'par' for woodworkers.

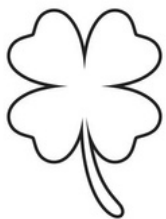
