LONG-TERM PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Long-Term Planning Committee met in July and September to renew the committee after a period of inactivity/inaction. In the July meeting, chaired by Trustee Rawlinson, we reviewed the "Mission Statement" adopted by the committee at its inception. The Mission Statement is reproduced below:

The purpose of this Committee is to bring forth to the Board of Trustees, fiscally responsible, community driven, short, medium, and long term recommendations for the health, welfare, benefit, and enjoyment of the residents of Bayshore Gardens.

We also viewed some samples of outdoor exercise equipment that a member of the committee had researched.

The September meeting was primarily devoted to formulating the plan itself. We had guests in addition to the committee members! What is needed before we can develop the plan is community input, per our mission statement. Any plan begins with an assessment of where we are now and where we want to go. A written survey is the most efficient way to collect your information.

Here is the fun part of this committee! We are open to all ideas and suggestions from community members. From previous surveys, residents have told us that beach restoration and fitness equipment are high on the list of desired improvements for our assessment

dollars. What else should be on that list? What do you want in the future? What are you using or not using now? We need the input prior to setting the budget for 2024-2025 year.

This committee needs more resident members. It is a very important committee for the District. It is the job of the committee in addition to community input, to determine the financial resources available to the District, factor in maintenance issues, prioritize issues already on the drawing board, and then use the collected resident data to establish a timeline for getting the things the community has said you want. At the October meeting, we will be discussing the results of the contact with the Regional DEP office concerning the permitting process for mangrove removal as the first step in beach restoration. We will also be discussing a sample mail-in survey to get your input. Please feel free to join us and give us your thoughts.

Committee meetings are held the first Tuesday or Wednesday (check the calendar in the Banner or on the website, www.bayshoregardens.org) of each month at 7:00 pm in the Recreation Center. Please join us either as a new committee member, or as a welcome guest.

John invited everyone to tour their Master Gardens office/garden in Palmetto. They will have their annual Master Gardener Volunteer Plant Sale Saturday, October 7, from 9- noon (1303 17th St W, Palmetto, FL 34221). Free tickets are available online.

John grew up in Maryland and has been an herb and fruit tree enthusiast for many years. September is a good time for us to plant seeds for the herbs we want. Herbs are mostly drought tolerant. In fact, water can kill herbs, as they need drainage. Most herbs like the sun (6 hours) or partial shade. Insects don't really like them. They don't need fertilizers. They like to be pruned. Container growing is best, inside, or outdoors.

Types of herbs covered: culinary herb, edible flowers, medical herbs (safe, need to tell your doctor if you use them). John gave us a long list of herbs, with headings of Culinary, Tea Herbs, and Edible Flowers.

John Dawson discussed several herbs, too many to discuss here. There are 320 culinary herbs that can grow here. John described several edible herbs, their origins, names, shade/sun needs, and pruning (harvesting) methods. And how to save the seeds of annuals for next year.

John described herbs with different names, and different origins. i.e., Cilantro may taste soapy to some, the Mexican Coriander does not. They look different but the Coriander has better flavor than cilantro.

Herbs shared at the meeting: pine cone (shampoo) ginger lily, ginger root, rosemary branch, and basil seeds. We tasted a mint and guessed the name: chocolate mint. We found out Basil is in the mint family and most mints have square stems.

John prefers growing herbs from seeds. He cautioned to not disturb the root of a new plant when transplanting. He uses pieces of PVC pipe or paper towel tubes to isolate the new plant/rooting from its surrounding soil so it can be moved /replanted without disturbing the roots. When

starting cuttings, strip leaves off the stem up through the bottom two nodes and put in the water. Use rooting hormones. Roots sprout from the nodes. When roots have grown a half inch, put it in soil. A little different: Cuttings can be started in an aloe leaf or banana fruit (plant the banana or aloe leaf in the ground with the cutting inserted). To sterilize containers, use a solution ratio of 1:10 bleach to water.

There was a Q&A session at the end of the presentation. We thanked John Dawson for the wonderful, informative presentation. We adjourned at 3:00.
